Harmony Village is a small community located in an old established orchard sanctuary. Cultural and community development is at the core of the creative projects conceived and developed by the artists in residence. Scattered amongst the dwellings and the Harmony Centre are many gardens with a vast array of sculptural pieces to enjoy, making a stroll around the village an open air gallery experience. Harmony supports personal development through Anthroposophically inspired arts, therapies and education with a focus on community and social interaction.

**Mixed media** - French born but citizen of the world, *Francis Mougel* has been exhibiting in Europe and the South Pacific for over 30 years. Working in Mixed media, his 'Painting From The Heart' are subtle but potent imaginations of nature's features and spiritual realities.

**Oils** - Trained in Old Master's Historical Oil painting Techniques at The Charlie Sheard Studio School in Sydney, *Deborah Lema's* work is inspired by Goethe's Theory on colour.

Spanish born *Conchita Carambano* brings her unique perception of colour to rich and textural oil paintings inspired by the Australian landscape. Forms, motifs and idiosyncratic lines articulate her surfaces, sometimes playfully and evoke qualities of the ancient and primordial in her intuitive and evocative works.

**Sculpture** - Peaceful and feminine works seek harmony through the vehicle of the human form in *Anna Harpley's* interpretation of traditional classical sculpture. The sensuality of clay and the wrought expression of wax are palpable in these pieces, ultimately cast in bronze, marble and resin and plaster.

A landscape sculptor with three decades of experience as a sculptor and artisan, *David Ball's* versatility is overwhelming. He weaves his steel structures throughout homes and gardens and a number of his creations are well integrated in the 'Village'.

'Catavento Studio' founder *Michael Pfahl* is inspired by the marriage of Architecture and Sculpture, which he believes are deeply connected. His creation 'Study for a Chapel' is the perfect expression of his passion.

**Photography** - An experienced Artist Photographer with a gift for evoking narrative through images, *Neil Fenelon* is a master of light and atmosphere.

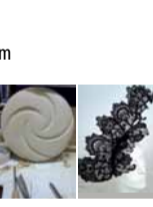

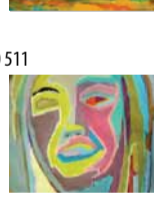

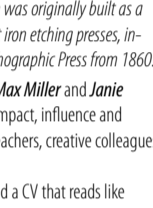
Situated in a valley amidst semi rainforest, *Studio 21* comprises two artist studios located next to the old Australian stone building which was originally built as a schoolhouse for East Kangaloon in 1876. View the cast iron etching presses, including an 1850s Letterpress and a wooden French Lithographic Press from 1860.

**Paintings, Pastels and Etchings** - To describe *Max Miller* and *Janie Bligh* as Professional Established Artists belies their impact, influence and achievement as pure and lifetime artists, travellers, teachers, creative colleagues and artist advocates.

With awards and exhibition lists as long as an arm and a CV that reads like a who's who of Australian Art, *Max Miller* has etched his way into the folklore of Australian art. He describes himself as a painter and etcher, and paints with watercolour on handmade paper and oil on linen. He "goes bush" whenever he can and paints landscapes and botanics in an evolutionary way and attributes the influence of China, India and Japan to his contemplative abstract works. "It's a beautiful life", he says. "All I ever wanted to be was an artist!"

An artist in her own right, the highly credentialed and much exhibited *Janie Bligh* works with pastels and watercolour to primarily create landscapes of inland Australia.
